Baptism - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

Pre-Jordan - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is March 11 @ 7 pm in the Chapel.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for **each** child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

Marriage - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

The scripture readings for our Lenten season have a mixture of themes, all meant to give us an opportunity to remember and renew our faith and to help us on our journey to Easter.

The Old Testament readings will help us reflect on God's promises and the fulfillment of those promises. In the second readings, the Epistles of Paul, he affirms that both Jew and Gentile are heirs to God's promises.

In our Gospel readings for Lent we are shown various aspects of Jesus' character and identity. He is revealing himself to us through the inspired word.

Today in our first reading, Moses tells us that the first fruits of the harvest are to be offered to God in gratitude for God's gift of the land. The word Deuteronomy literally means 'second law'. It is a restating of much of what went before in the book of Exodus. Mount Horeb in Deuteronomy is in Exodus called Mt Sinai. Moses is summing up the declaration of laws. The recitation of God's actions from the promises to Abraham through Exodus and then the settlement of the land remind the people of the debt they owe to God. This is repaid by his people by proper sacrifice and obedience. We give our best to the Lord by bringing our best when we come to celebrate Eucharist.

In the Gospel we see Jesus entering into a Forty Day experience in the desert. This was in preparation for his public ministry of preaching and healing. This Palestinian desert was a dangerous place, semi-arid, uncharted, inhabited by wild beasts and bandits. The wilderness was believed to be the haunt of demons, so it is no surprise that Jesus met the devil there. Jesus' forty days in the desert is meant to trigger an association with Israel's forty years of wandering in the desert after the Exodus. Jesus is tested in the desert but remains faithful. Jesus answers the three temptations with the Scriptural word of God. When the devil even tries to use Scripture himself, Jesus is quick to turn aside the challenge to his Father's fidelity.

Lent is our forty day experience to recall the story of God's saving love affair with us and to grow in gratitude for his mercy. It is meant to prepare us to celebrate the Easter mysteries. Feeding on the Word of God and the liturgy can guide us to live the death and resurrection of Jesus more clearly this year.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
