CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

Baptism - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is to be announced. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

Marriage - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance

Pastor's Page

Today we begin the last week of the holiest of seasons, the Easter Season. The Easter Season will end next Sunday, Pentecost Sunday after Evening Prayer. The Paschal Candle returns to its place near the Baptismal font and we return to Ordinary Time. We now prepare to celebrate the great Solemnity of Pentecost, which is also called, 'the birthday of the Church." The scripture readings today offer some insights into the role of the Holy Spirit in the early Church as seen in Acts, and reflection on Jesus' words to his followers at the Last Supper as depicted in John's gospel.

The number twelve is significant in Israel's salvation history. Jacob one of the Patriarchs of the Hebrews (Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph in Genesis 11-50) had twelve sons. The interesting point is that they were not all with the same wife. Remember that Polygamy was part of the prevailing culture of that time. This was before monogamy became part of the teaching of the Chosen People.

The twelve sons of Jacob were from two wives, Leah and Rachel and there were sons born of consorts of both Leah and Rachel. The whole story on this can be found starting with Jacob's deception of his father Isaac in Genesis 27 through to Chapter 35 that details the sons of Jacob by name.

The twelve sons of Jacob later become twelve tribes of Israel as the Hebrews come out of Egypt and move toward the Promised Land. When Jesus begins his public ministry he establishes a special role for his "Apostles" those whom he is going to send in a special mission as his witnesses.

Today in Acts, with Judas Iscariot's betrayal, Peter, acting in his role of the leader of those gathered, proposes that a new Apostle be chosen to continue this mission. The major criteria of this role will include participation in the life and ministry of Jesus until his death. Matthias is chosen by lot. The twelve Apostles are again complete. We also hear how important it is that the Church be unified in its mission.

This was not just a game of chance, choosing by lot. The prayer of the Apostles is directed to Jesus and the Holy Spirit.: "You Lord, know the hearts of all, show which of these two you have chosen to take the place in this apostolic ministry..."

In John's Gospel today, Jesus is including the followers in his own intimate conversation with God the Father. As is the example of the Our Father in Luke and Matthew, this is another lesson to us on how to approach our own prayer. It is essentially conversation with the Father. This is not only speaking but just as important, listening.

Jesus asks that the union he shares with the Father include the disciples: "so that they may be one just as we are one" (John 17:11b). This union effectively makes all followers of Jesus "children of God." This Sunday between Ascension and Pentecost is an image of our liturgical year location between the already of Jesus proclaiming the kingdom and the not yet of its fulfillment. Let us continue to make this journey. Jesus himself prays that we will be protected, unified and filled with joy.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
