CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

Pastor's Page

During Eastertide we hear many stories from the Acts of the Apostles.

Acts begins with a description of Jesus Ascension into heaven and moves onto the story of Pentecost. It then describes the early days of the church as the Good News of Jesus spread throughout the Roman Empire. Because Acts always attributes the growth of the church to the workings of the Holy Spirit among believers it is often referred to as the "Gospel of the Holy Spirit".

Roughly the first half of the book focuses on the life of the first Christian community living in Jerusalem. This involves various apostles and disciples there, emerging conflicts between Christians and Jews – all leading up to the conversion of Paul.

The second half of Acts is dominated by the personality, preaching and missionary travels of Paul and his coworkers. The focus shifts from the growth of the church in Jerusalem to Paul's spreading the Gospel message beyond Palestine and to the Gentiles of the Roman world. Acts ends with Paul reaching Rome, which at that time was considered "the ends of the earth."

Beyond the description of Jesus' Ascension into heaven, Acts does not tell us anything new about Jesus. What is interesting however, is that we see how the Apostles began to explain and proclaim their experience of Jesus to various audiences. Acts includes eighteen discourses or speeches by various characters – eight of them by Paul. Acts is filled with high drama and action packed fascinating stories that tell about the spread of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the first century. It is excellent reading during the Easter Season and I commend this to your own personal spiritual reading during this 40 days of Easter.

The first reading in our liturgy today describes the end of Paul and Barnabas' first missionary journey. At each stop Paul and Barnabas begin in the local synagogue where Gentile God fearers are part of the assembly. God had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles but it would take the Council of Jerusalem to figure out exactly how these Gentiles would be incorporated into the faith. The key line in this reading today is: "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the Kingdom of God".

In the gospel we hear again Jesus commandment to love one another. Let us be grateful for a God who loves us so much, and pray for the grace to put into action this commandment of Jesus, whether it be toward family or toward strangers we encounter on the street. Let us learn to love one another as Jesus has loved us.



SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ **CONFIRMATION**

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
