CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan TBA**

Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

Pastor's Page

In our passage from the Acts of the Apostles today in the first reading we see the early Church faced with controversy. The very first Christians were faithful Jews who believed Jesus to be the Messiah only to the Jewish people. It was not long however before the Apostles realized that God was offering salvation to the whole world, including Gentiles.

Although Peter and the other apostles accepted the mission to the Gentiles, a debate arose over whether non-Jewish Christians would be required to follow Jewish laws. The Jewish followers of Jesus argued that the Gentiles had to become Jews before they could be baptized into Christianity. Then they would have to follow all the other Jewish laws and prescriptions. Paul and the Gentiles felt strongly that Gentiles should be baptized directly into Christianity.

The Gentile question came to a head about ten years after the decision to accept Gentiles as Christians. Paul and two of his co-workers-Barnabas a Jew by birth and Titus a Gentile convert- had traveled to Jerusalem to consult with Peter, James and John. Both groups wanted to make sure that they were all preaching the same Good News.

A problem ensued however when some Jewish converts demanded that Titus be circumcised, a requirement for all Jewish males before being accepted as complete Christian. A conference was called at which it was decided that respect certain Jewish laws. This conference became known as the Council of Jerusalem.

"It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities...." Acts 15:28 (I would suggest reading the entire Chapter 28 of the Acts of the Apostles to get the full context of the discussion and discernment).

Even after the Gentile conversion controversy had been resolved, the tension at times became bitter and lasted for several years and became the focus of much of Paul's writing. Paul's strong stand on the part of the Gentiles during this debate was a leading reason the Christian faith became a world-wide religion rather than remaining a small Jewish sect.

In the Gospel today, Jesus promises his disciples that God will continue to dwell with them. He promises that they will receive the Holy Spirit who will continue to enlighten them.

This issue in Acts today is a great lesson of how the early church learned to listen to the Holy Spirit and work together to bring about peace of mind to the members of the community. Peace to keep their hearts from being troubled. Peace to protect them from feat. Peace to stay with them forever. Our loving God invites us to work together to spread the Good News. We must learn to discern the work of the Holy Spirit and unite ourselves in the mission that God has given us.

Post Script – A reminder that this Thursday is the Feast of the Ascension, a Holyday of Obligation. Jesus ascends to the Father, concluding this 40- day period of his post resurrection appearances. At the Ascension, Jesus commissions his disciples to baptize in his name and reminding them and us that he is always present through his Holy Spirit. The Easter Season is not over however. We still have 10 days to prepare to celebrate Pentecost. The Paschal Candle continues to burn in its proper place near the Ambo during Easter season.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
