### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

**<u>Baptism</u>** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>**Pre-Jordan</u></u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent <b>Pre-Jordan is to be announced.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for **each** child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.</u>

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

**<u>RCIA</u>** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

# Pastor's Page

"In the name of the Father who created me, and of the Son who redeemed me and of the Holy Spirit who sanctifies me." This is what I called the enhanced sign of the cross. This was the way you blessed yourself whenever we began prayer in Sister Marita Joseph's IHM 8<sup>th</sup> grade class at Good Shepherd parish in Southwest Philadelphia. This was especially true when we blessed the hour. In our parish, the church bells rang every hour from 8AM until 10PM at night. It was almost impossible not to know when the next hour was beginning. We stopped whatever we were doing and blessed the hour.

It is amazing with all the lessons I had experienced over a 20 year period in formal classroom schooling (8 elementary, 4 high school, 8 seminary) that this is one that stuck with me all these years.

The Scripture Readings for today's feast present the Trinity as less of a theological doctrine and more as the revelation of God's deepening personal relationship with us. Today as we celebrate Trinity Sunday, we can place our focus not only on who the three persons of the Trinity are, but rather on who we are in relation to the Holy Trinity. For God has sought us out (I call each of you by name: Isaiah 43:1) and saved us through Jesus Christ and given us a Spirit of adoption. The Responsorial Psalm today, Psalm 33 gives us another indication of God reaching out to his people. "Blessed the people the Lord has chosen to be his own."

In the second reading today, in the Epistle to the Romans, Paul uses the image of adoption to depict how the baptized are now sons and daughters of God. In the Roman legal system, of which Paul was a citizen as opposed to Peter for example, adoption was a legitimate means of securing an heir. The adopted one would share in all the same rights as if he or she had been born to the parents. Paul confirms that we are children of God, joint heirs with Christ. This is a great gift and advantage for us. We are invited in to the life of the Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

In these days following the great Fifty Days of the Easter Season, we celebrate the nature of God. We believe in a God who is Three Persons in one Godhead – diversity in perfect community. Thus, the nature of God is the mystery of relationship. God's love is mutually given and received by the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Moreover, we believe that this love is so abundant that God freely shares it with the world. Love begets love; grace builds upon grace (Of his fullness we have all had a share – love following upon love. John 1:16).

We are called to respond and build up a community of diversity abiding in unity. The intimate relationship between Father, Son and Spirit is an essential part of God's identity. From all eternity, God has been in relationship. God has never been alone. God has never left us alone.

## **Parish Resources**

#### <u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
