#### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

**<u>Baptism</u>** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is May 13 at 7 pm in the Chapel.

Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for **each** child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least **6 months** in advance.

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep—Spring Session is May 31.

**RCIA** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

#### Pastor's Page

Every Sunday of the Easter season gives us an opportunity to continue to contemplate the mystery of Christ's Resurrection. It is especially a time of grace for our parish as we celebrate the Annual Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotions this week.

In each of the readings today we find signs of God's abundant life and forgiveness. The early church proclaims the Good News. The apostles catch a large number of fish. Peter is forgiven. Let us celebrate by recalling the signs of the Resurrection in our world and in our own lives today.

In the Acts of the Apostles today the Sanhedrin is "filled with fury" because of the success of the early preaching in Jerusalem. The Council has the Apostles put in jail but an angel of the Lord releases them, so that by the next morning they are preaching in the Temple. The guards have them rounded up once again and brought before the Sanhedrin. Though commanded to "stop preaching in that name" Peter now emboldened by the Spirit announces, "we must obey God rather than men". The Gospel must be preached!!!

In today's Gospel Jesus appears to the apostles after the Resurrection, and even prepares a meal for them. As we listen to this passage today, let us reflect on the many ways Christ comes to us and feeds us in our own lives. We need to seek Jesus out and spend time with him, in his Word and Sacrament. His presence will sustain us and give us the strength to live out our Baptismal calling.

#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
