#### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

Pre-Jordan - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, May 22 @ 7 PM in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

#### Pastor's Page

As the Easter season progresses in the Sunday scriptures we find ourselves focusing less on the early church and more on what we do now. Jesus gives us a roadmap in today's Gospel. The Gospels for the next few weeks are taken from what is called the farewell discourse in John's Gospel.

Today Jesus reassures Thomas, Phillip and us who don't understand where Jesus is going much less how to follow him there. Our focus should be directed to knowing and believing in Jesus, and his words and we will find the way. It is not always easy to do this.

We can see a very good example of how the early church community sorted out a big issue in the first reading from the Acts. The Apostles have to expand the leadership because of the Church's rapid growth. Like Jesus, the Twelve had all been from Galilee and spoke Aramaic as their basic language. Jews from all over the world gathered in Jerusalem and many of the Christian Jews were more comfortable speaking Greek which was the international language of that time. The term "Hellenistic" describes people who were of Greek background and culture. There was a tension between these groups.

Acts presents the early church's very human nature. Ultimately this tension is resolved. The ministry of the Word, service to one another and the Spirit of Jesus combine to keep them together. The Holy Spirit helps the community resolve its difficulties so that deeper unity develops even as a healthy diversity eventually flourishes. It is important to note that the resolution keeps people in rather than driving them out. The diverging perspectives that prompt the dispute prove less important than the common bond that binds the two sides together. The Hebrew/Aramaic majority does not dismiss the concerns of the Greek speaking minority, "the outsiders". The community structure is modified and its ministry expanded in creative continuity, enhancing both worship and witness.

In John's Gospel today, the disciples are troubled because Jesus is talking about his departure. Jesus insists on the necessity of faith, stating that he goes to prepare a place for them and he will return to take them with him. Thomas asks, "how can we know the way"? Jesus answer is that Christian hope is not in a method or procedure but in a person. Jesus himself is the "the way, the truth and the life." Through and in Jesus, one comes to the Father, knows the Father and sees the Father.

Phillip then still does not understand and states, "Master, show us the Father" Jesus seems to give a sigh of frustration, but this is part of the process of faith. Jesus responds, "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me Phillip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. The discussion continues, pointing to the perfect union of Jesus with the Father.

The Lord Jesus is God's Word to us. Jesus completes the lesson. "In my Father's house there are many dwelling places." For the believer, that future begins in the present.

#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
