CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is November 13 at 7 PM in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep will be offered on **Saturday**, **December 9**. See page 5 of the bulletin for further information.

<u>RCIA</u> - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Pastor's Page

As we move toward the conclusion of the Church's Liturgical year, our liturgies start to make a decisive shift in theme. The scripture readings focus more on the end-times. Today in the readings Wisdom is presented as a central and necessary value. The wisdom that we need will enable us to be ready for the second coming of the Lord. It also will enable us to be the best followers of Jesus that we can be in the present also.

The Book of Wisdom is probably the last book written chronologically in the Old Testament. Evidence indicates it was written in the second century before Christ. The purpose of the book was to build up the faith of its Jewish readers. Some readers would be Pius Jews and the author encouraged their faith amid the troubles of life. Other readers were probably less convinced of Israel's faith and became captivated by Greek philosophy. For them, the book would support the traditional faith against developments of science and free thinking, reminding them of the nobility of their religion in comparison with that of their pagan neighbors. For those readers who had abandoned Judaism the book called them back to God. For Gentile readers the book pointed to the folly of idol worship.

In the Gospel of Matthew today, we hear the parable of the ten bridesmaids. It is unique to Matthew's gospel. This parable contains many features already present in previous parables. The ten bridesmaids are divided into two groups: the foolish and the wise. The foolish ones have made no provisions for lighting their torches. The wise ones have made provision. The story assumes the Palestinian custom of the bridegrooms going to the bride's house in order to make the marital agreement with his father in law. When the bridegroom returns with the bride to his own home, the wedding feast can begin.

The bridesmaids are expected to meet the bridegroom and the bride as they approach the house. The foolish bridesmaids are sure that the bridegroom will not arrive at night, but the wise ones recognize that he can arrive at any time! The foolish bridesmaids are caught by surprise and are unable to obtain oil in time for the beginning of the wedding feast. The door is then locked and they are refused entrance. The lesson is constant watchfulness.

The message of the Gospel is clear. Stay awake and ready yourselves for the coming of the Lord. What do we think we need to do to prepare for the Lord's coming? What about our lamps? We should reflect on the flickering flame, the light of Christ, that each of us received at our Baptism. Our individual flame was lit from the one Light of Christ. We (most likely through our parents and godparents) are then given the admonition that it be kept burning brightly throughout our lives. Meditate on the words "wise" "ready" and "awake" today.



SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
