Pastor's Page

The Solemnity we celebrate today sees Jesus wearing a crown of contradictions. We celebrate majesty in humility, strength in weakness, power in gentleness. The challenge for us is to live humble, weak, gentle lives as Jesus did, as we follow his teaching and example, so that one day we will be crowned with his glory.

Today serves as an example of the kind of kingship that belonged to the Lord Jesus. Instead of an earthly throne, the cross was his throne. Instead of an earthly crown of gold and jewels, his was a crown of thorns. As we seek to imitate Christ in his suffering so as to share in his resurrection, we ask God for the strength to do this.

The second reading from Paul's letter to the Colossians is a good starting point today. In the passage today, we hear an ancient Christian hymn declaring Christ Jesus as cosmic Lord and peacemaker. The setting of the hymn serves to remind the community to lead a life worthy of the Lord. Christ is identified as "the very image of the invisible God, first born of all creation, universal in his effect ("all things were created through him") v.16

The Gospel today is a scene from the crucifixion. The incident of the good thief is unique to Luke's Gospel. The criminal who mocks Jesus is said to be blaspheming, a conclusion regarding Jesus' true identity. The other criminal asks Jesus to remember him when he begins his reign. He is referring to the definitive messianic kingdom the Jews expected at the end of the present age. In Luke's theology it also refers to the time of Jesus exaltation through resurrection and ascension.

Jesus in his dialogue with the man, promises him a place in "Paradise" <u>TODAY</u>, because the death of Jesus is beginning the exodus that will open a new way to salvation. It should be noted that late Old Testament Jewish writing considered paradise an intermediate state of happiness before the final judgement.

As we conclude the Liturgical year this week, it would be good to reflect on what our merciful God has done for us. How appropriate that as we end the liturgical year we hear the Gospel in which the Good Thief asks Jesus to remember him when Jesus comes into his kingdom. As we listen to these words, can we too come before the Lord Jesus and ask for mercy in our sinfulness?

Don't forget Thanksgiving Day is this week and while it is not a "Holyday of Obligation" in the traditional sense it is in a sense an American Holy Day. Mass on Thanksgiving Day will be at 9 am in Church. Participating in the Holy Sacrifice to give our thanks and praise for every good thing the Lord has given us is a very proper way to begin the Holiday season and put us in the proper frame of mind spiritually to begin Advent next week. Jesus' words after the healing of the Samaritan leper echo, "Ten were healed were they not, where are the other nine"?

As part of our own prayer and reflection, let us take the time over this last week of the liturgical year to make an inventory of God's goodness to us so that our prayers of Thanksgiving may overflow.

Parish Resources

<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> <u>CONFIRMATION</u>

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
