Pastor's Page

We come together today as we do each Sunday to praise and thank God and to celebrate the Eucharist as Jesus has called us to do. We do all this in a spirit of humility, aware that all we need and are and all we have ultimately comes from God and that the Eucharist is our "food for the journey", Christ's own Body and Blood.

In the first reading we hear from the Prophet Malachi, who preached to the people after the period of the Babylonian Exile. (approx. 538 BC) Although restored to their land, they had some restrictions namely they were not allowed to establish the line of King David, which in a way was not a bad thing because the failures in this area had led to the downfall in the first place. In its place the Levitical priesthood had taken more of a governing role as it had done in earlier times in Israel's history and as had been envisioned in the Law of Moses. Unfortunately the priests in this time in Judah were abusing their authority and this is what Malachi is speaking out about in this passage.

We are reminded today that we have all been called to a life of service before God. Malachi specifically addressed the priests who of all people should be setting a better example. Paul reminds the Thessalonians that the Apostles gave their very selves in their work and ministry. And Jesus in the Gospel warns the crowds what will happen if one exalts oneself. We need to ponder God's word with humble hearts.

Our true humility should teach us and make us aware that none of us is created more in the image and likeness of God than anyone else. Jesus lesson for all of us is that we are all called to serve, not to be served. "The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled but whoever humbles himself will be exalted" (Matt 23:11-12)

Jesus insists upon the interior bonds of faith and its practical results in daily life. Jesus called out those who's religious observance is all show, "performed to be seen" Jesus is addressing the interior attitude of faith.

My calves and fatted cattle are killed. Everything is ready. Come to the Feast." Jesus himself is that Eucharistic Banquet. Jesus himself is our Passover Lamb, our food for the journey. We need to respond and share this invitation with others.

Each Tuesday the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for our adoration in our Sacred Heart Chapel from 9 am to 6:30 pm. **Benediction and Novena follows.**



<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
