### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, November 14, at 7pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

### Pastor's Page

The seven brothers and their mother in the first reading today from 2Maccabees exemplify how faith in God helps us face even death. They were in a very bad situation about 175 BC when the Greek King Antiochus IV was in power. He decided to force religious unity throughout his kingdom. He then made it a crime to practice the Jewish religion. Circumcision was forbidden. Copies of the scriptures were burned. Jews were not allowed to observe the dietary laws or celebrate their usual feasts. Some of the Jews gave into the Greeks while others fought hard to hold on to their traditional faith.

St. Paul in his letter to the Thessalonians today encourages us as he prays that our hearts will be encouraged and strengthened as we continue our journey of faith and conversion. He wants us to be strengthened and encouraged in every good deed and word.

In the Gospel passage from Luke 20:27-38 Jesus Is challenged by the Sadducees, who appear in this gospel for the only time. The Sadducees were the aristocratic leaders who scorned the Pharisees and their beliefs and interpretation of the law. The Sadducees controlled the temple and the priesthood. The Sadducees were decidedly liturgically conservative but more liberal on Jewish practices and the Greek culture. They accepted only the first 5 books of the Scriptures, The Pentateuch. (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy). While the Pharisees would be open to the bodily Resurrection, the Sadducees would see this as total folly.

In contrast to the Sadducees the Pharisees advocated strict adherence to the law to insure purity. They saw the Synagogue as the center of Jewish life. The Synagogue was the local place of prayer and worship in each local community. This is to be distinguished from the Temple, which was in Jerusalem. There was only one Temple.

In Jewish law, a brother was supposed to raise an heir for his childless dead brother so that the property would not leave the family and his brother's name would continue in his posterity. The Sadducees pose a case that they think will force Jesus either to renounce the resurrection or to allow polyandry which was considered immoral. Jesus replies that the succession of husbands is a problem for the Sadducees only because they have not understood the meaning of the resurrection. Resurrected life and current existence are two completely different things. In heaven the marriage relationship will be transcended by a new kind of relationship that will not involve procreation.

When the Sadducees ask Jesus about whose wife the bride of the seven brothers will be at the resurrection, it is clear they miss the point. Resurrected life is a new reality in which people "can no longer die, for they are like angels". The encounters between Jesus and his disciples following his resurrection reveal how long it took for his disciples to understand this.

What is sure is that we will live in a new way. Ours is not the God of the dead, but of the living. Our faith will carry us through this life, past death and into new life.

### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
