CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is November 5 at 7 PM in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

The Old Testament reading today is taken from the Book of Wisdom. In some circles it is thought Solomon himself was the author and it is titled "The Wisdom of Solomon". Solomon himself never appears in the book as the author. Scholarship has shown us that the Book of Wisdom was written very late in the Old Testament period. The estimate is that the book was composed around 50 BC.

It is interesting to note that this book is not accepted by the Hebrew Canon of scripture and it is not in the Protestant canon either. Martin Luther had it stricken from the record. Because Jesus and especially the Apostles were exposed to the Greek translation of the Book of Wisdom, the Septuagint, the Wisdom literature of the Old Testament is considered Canonical, part of the inspired Word of God, by the Catholic Church.

The purpose of the book and really all of the Hebrew wisdom literature, is to build up the faith of its Jewish readers. It is also very instructive for Christian readers and listeners. The book of Wisdom has a distinctly Greek background and it aims to combine the Greek philosophy of life, which many Hebrews had been exposed and the traditional Hebrew faith. Many readers had abandoned Judaism in Egypt and this book was calling them back to God.

During the centuries before the birth of Jesus, the people of Israel were under foreign domination. Judah fell under Babylonian control in 587 BC. Later they were ruled by the Persians, Greeks and finally Roman rule in 63 BC. The Greek influence remained however. During this time, many Jews were scattered beyond Palestine to places far from home, where they settled as strangers in strange lands. It was the hand of God that inspired the scriptures to help them keep the faith alive. They had to respond to the challenges that foreign cultures and powers brought to every aspect of their life.

There are seven books of the Old Testament that the Catholic Canon of the Old Testament considers the Wisdom Literature. The Wisdom Books are: Proverbs, Job, Ecclesiastes, Wisdom, Sirach, Song of Songs and the Book of Psalms.

In the passage today, Solomon is seen praying, and he chooses wisdom over power or riches. He realizes that those things such as gold and silver are temporary, whereas wisdom is lasting.

In the Gospel, a potential disciple is confronted with an astounding answer to his question on "inheriting eternal life". It is not enough to follow the law. One must remove all obstacles to discipleship. In the case of this man, his wealth prevented him from submitting fully to God. He left when challenged by Jesus. The disciples saw the man's fidelity to the Law and his wealth as attesting to his high standard before God.

The disciples became confused because the man fit their idea of success. They then asked Jesus, "then who can be saved?" This is a reasonable question. Jesus responds that humanity is unable to achieve salvation by itself. Only God can save. Fidelity to the law is important, yes, and attitude of surrender and a willingness to follow, mark the potential disciple. It is God's ultimate act through Jesus that achieves "eternal life in the age to come" Mk 10:30.



SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
