CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is November 13 at 7 PM in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

The image of a banquet is an important one in sacred scripture. Most of the time it points out to us God's great generosity and lavish kindness. In the New Testament, Jesus uses the banquet as an image of the heavenly kingdom to come. We each received our invitation at our Baptism. Do we prepare properly to celebrate each Eucharistic Banquet we participate in? Today is a good day to rediscover our invitation to the Heavenly Banquet and to assess what we do to prepare ourselves in the present and in the future.

In the Old Testament reading from Isaiah today (25:6-10) we see the image of a banquet that suggests a celebration after a victory is won. The image of a great banquet comes from ancient mythology and has a long history in the folklore of the world. In this case, the banquet is given "on this mountain", referring to Mount Zion. This would be a feast for all peoples in accordance with a tradition that all the nations would flock to Zion. This feast is described with mouth-watering vividness. It reflects the desire of an impoverished people for a bountiful meal.

Our desired salvation goes beyond even the banquet, as Isaiah states. God will destroy death forever. God will ultimately remove every threat that hangs over humanity, including the ultimate one. This foreshadows the mission of the Messiah many years later. In this particular context from Isaiah, with a people in exile, God will remove all sorrow and humiliation of the Jewish people as a result of the exile.

In the Gospel today we hear a tale of a royal marriage feast. It has many features in common with the parable of the Tenants that we previously heard. The marriage feast or banquet was a popular way of imagining what life in the coming kingdom would be like. The king and his son clearly represent God and Jesus respectively. The invitation offered by the first group of servants (the prophets) is refused, but the invitation given by the second group, perhaps John the Baptist or Jesus encounters not only indifference but also hostility to the point that those servants are executed.

Because the people of Israel refused the invitation to the kingdom of God, a general invitation has been made to all kinds of people, including tax collectors and prostitutes and perhaps even non-Jews. We need to take note however, that mere acceptance of the invitation does not guarantee participation in the banquet as the incident in verses 11-13 make clear. Guests at a wedding banquet would be expected to appear in clean, neat clothing. Being a tax collector or prostitute (or a baptized catholic!) is no more a guarantee of salvation than being a Pharisee or chief priest.

The lesson in the story is one must receive Jesus' invitation of the kingdom and act upon it so that when the banquet actually begins, one will be properly prepared to participate. In this context, the saying in verse 14 (the invited are many, the elect are few) suggests that the invitation to the kingdom has been offered to all sorts of people, but only a few of them act upon it in such a way as to be allowed to participate in the banquet of the kingdom.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
