CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

Pre-Jordan - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is November 13 at 7 PM in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

Today our Epistle lesson is drawn from the thanksgiving verses found in the first letter that Paul wrote to the church in Thessalonica. This brief letter is most likely the earliest letter written by Paul. That would make it the oldest extant writing in the New Testament and therefore the oldest extant document in Christianity. It was previously thought that 1 Thessalonians should be read in light of the Acts of the Apostles. This is not the way to look at this letter now. Scholarly evidence indicates 1 Thessalonians is a first-hand document written by the Apostle Paul who was himself present for these events. Since Acts was written about thirty-five years later and after Paul's death, we can see clearly that 1Thessalonians can stand alone and does not have to be read in light of the Acts. The account of the founding of the Church at Thessalonica as given in Acts 17 is quite different from the information we can see in the letter. It is questionable therefore whether the two accounts can be or should be harmonized.

The congregation that Paul is writing to is located in the port city of Thessalonica in Macedonia. This would be the modern city of Thessalonike in Northern Greece. It seems to be primarily if not entirely a Gentile congregation. Most likely the letter was sent from Athens or Corinth about the year 51 AD. We need to keep in mind that even though the Gospels are placed first in any New Testament collection, followed by Acts and then the Epistles this does not indicate in any way a chronology of the writings. Keep in mind that the Epistles represent a different kind of writing from the Gospels. The Gospels were a special literary from that emerged to preserve the story of Jesus and his message. An epistle or letter was a common means of communication of the day.

Paul would not have expected his letters to be preserved as part of a treasury of sacred Christian literature because he shared the wide spread belief that Jesus would return in glory within a generation, at which time the world as people knew it would end. Although the first Christians likely recognized Paul's letters as particularly valuable, the Church would only later recognize his letters as sacred and worthy of the title of Sacred Scripture. That is where the inspiration of the Holy Spirit comes in.

Paul had started the church at Thessalonica and was extremely pleased with Timothy's report on how the congregation was doing. He gives thanks to God for their "work of faith", their "labor of love" and their "endurance in hope". Paul was a man of gratitude for his blessings. He was quick to express thanksgiving to his friends for what they had given him. He was likewise eager to express thanksgiving to God. That spirit of thanksgiving nourished a warm heart and a generous spirit toward all.

The main concern that Paul had about the church in Thessalonica was they were inordinately obsessed with questions about the end of time and the coming of Christ. Although these are certainly important issues they can also cause a person to lose perspective on the importance of living their life in the here and now. Paul was concerned that the overemphasis within the church on the end-time was making them lose perspective and opportunity in the meantime. He therefore writes to the Church to keep working, keep active, keep busy and let God take care of the big questions of time and destiny.

It seemed some of the church members, believing the end was near at hand, had quit their work, withdrawn from the world and simply sat back awaiting the coming of Christ. Paul admonishes them to get back to work, back to life, back to service. What better way to prepare for the coming of Christ than to be found busy in the work of the Kingdom when Christ returns.

Today is a relatively brief passage from the letter to the Thessalonians (1:1-5) I would suggest for spiritual reading this week the rest of the letter. It would be time well spent.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
