# **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

**<u>Baptism</u>** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is November 5 at 7 PM in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

# Pastor's Page

Today's Gospel is a sign of encouragement for us as Jesus hears and heals Bartimaeus. The name itself means, "son of the unclean one". People with such afflictions were thought to be sinners or someone in their family were sinners. They were to be avoided. They were outside the circle of salvation. It was not surprising that someone such as Bartimaeus was off to the side of the road. He had undoubtedly heard about Jesus and had faith. Although some people tried to quiet him, his persistence wins out. Jesus has his disciples call him closer. Bartimaeus responds with great enthusiasm. It is just such profound trust in Jesus that Mark wants to elicit from the Christian recipients of his Gospel.

When the blind man immediately received his sight he started to follow Jesus "on the way". This miracle-discipleship story becomes Mark's rallying call to his own Christian readers in their own situation on their way to the cross. "You have nothing to fear from him, get up! He is calling you!" Bartimaeus received physical sight to complement his spiritual insight.

Bartimaeus' response to Jesus encourages us to examine our own response. Jesus enlightens us in Baptism and nourishes us through his Word and Sacraments. The Letter to the Hebrews in our second reading today reminds us that Jesus is our merciful High Priest, who though sinless himself, "is able to deal patiently with the ignorant and the erring". Hearing our prayerful and persistent calls for healing and deliverance , Jesus reaches out to us.

The question that Jesus asks Bartimaeus is almost exactly the same as the one we heard him ask James and John last week: "What do you want me to do for you?" Where James and John asked for power and status, not seeing what they were really asking Jesus, Bartimaeus the blind man sees Jesus for who he is and asks for healing. Granted his request, Bartimaeus immediately followed Jesus. No dilly dally, no maybe next month or next time you come by....but immediately. Jesus' healing of Bartimaeus is a sign of the coming Kingdom of God, a sign that humanity's long exile from God is coming to an end.

As the responsorial Psalm today signs out, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy". After receiving the gift of sight, Bartimaeus responds to Jesus' call and follows him. As we gather in Jesus' name today, let us consider how he is calling us.

**PreK3:** Child must be 3 years of age and **fully potty trained** (without pull-ups) on or before September 1, 2025


**PreK4:** Child must be 4 years of age and **fully potty trained** (without pull-ups) on or before September 1, 2025

#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
