CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is November 5 at 7 PM in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

One of the teachings of the Book of Genesis is that humanity has an intimate relationship with God from the beginning. We were created in God's image. Not only that, but we also have an intimate relationship with each other, for the partner of the first human was created out of the first. These are some of the basic lessons that the creation story in Genesis tries to impart. We are made in the image and likeness of God and created to be in relationship with each other.

The motive given by Yahweh for the creation of woman is that, "It is not good for the man to be alone, I will make a suitable partner for him". This is the bedrock of the marriage relationship. The woman has an inherent dignity in the institution of Marriage. The woman is to be the one in whom man finds support and strength.

Even though the human creatures and the animals are both living beings, the animals do not prove to be a "suitable partner for the man." A second time, Yahweh attempts to form a suitable helper, and this time forms a woman from one of the ribs of the man. He is put into a deep sleep lest the act of creation be witnessed. The act of creation remains a divine mystery. When the woman is brought to the man, he exclaims in poetic form that at last a suitable partner has been found. Her mysterious creation by God from human substance underscores the common nature she shares with the man and the bond that unites them. This is a great gift that has continued to unfold for thousands of years to the present day.

In the Gospel, Jesus expands the biblical foundation for marriage by combining both the first story of Creation ("God made them male and female") Genesis 1:27, with the second ("for this reason a man shall leave......)
Genesis 2:24.

Though the argument with the Pharisees appears to concern divorce, the deeper point of division concerns the correct interpretation of Scripture. The Pharisees cite Moses (Deuteronomy 24:1), Jesus however, roots his teaching in God ("What God has joined...). The Gospel reading also includes the account of people bringing their children to Jesus. Though the disciples rebuke them, Jesus intervenes. The children are without status or power in the society and Jesus says it is to such as them that the Kingdom of Heaven belongs. As Jesus warns, "whoever does not accept the Kingdom of God like a child will not enter it" Mark 10:15.

We conclude with the author of the Hebrews who notes that in order to accomplish his mission Jesus needed to share in our humanity. In doing so, he became Emmanuel, a name that means "God is with us". We have an intimate connection not just with one another but with God. In today's passage, Jesus humanity and his death are acknowledged ("he was made lower than the angels thathe might taste death.") It is through this very death, this very real death, that Jesus perfected salvation. Jesus' suffering "completes" the salvation now available to us.

On this Respect Life Sunday we note that all life, everyone's life, is a gift from God, a gift given out of love by our Creator. All life is precious in God's eyes, from conception to natural death.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
