CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, November 14, at 7pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

Pastor's Page

In today's first reading and Gospel we see two remarkable healings from leprosy. This was a devastating disease in biblical times that had no cure and resulted in being completely removed from the society.

Within the Old Testament books of 1st and 2nd Kings is a cycle of stories about the prophets Elijah and Elisha. Elijah is regarded as Israel's greatest prophet and Elisha studied under Elisha succeeded and carried on the work of Elijah. Elisha was known for his healings and unbroken succession of wonders. He purifies Jericho's water supply, which had been causing deaths and miscarriages. He helps a widow avoid selling her children to pay her debts. He blesses a childless couple and they begat a son.

Elisha even becomes known among foreigners for his healing powers. Today we see Elisha cure Naaman a commander in the Syrian army of leprosy. He does this by having a servant tell Naaman to wash seven times in the Jordan river. Naaman balks at doing this because it seems so simple, but when he gives in and bathes in the river, he is cured. A grateful and humbler Naaman returns to Elisha believing in Elisha's God of Israel. He is thankful. So thankful he offers Naaman a gift, but he refuses. He says he will no longer offer sacrifice to any other God except the Lord.

An important facet of the Naaman story and the Gospel is that the cure goes beyond religious and nationalistic lines. Naaman was a Syrian and Jesus even cures a despised Samaritan.

Remember as we have been hearing these passages from Luke's Gospel, Jesus is traveling south from Galilee to Jerusalem. The main pilgrim route followed the Jordan valley so as to avoid going directly through Samaria. The lepers recognize him and cry out for his mercy. Jesus responds by sending them to the priests, in accordance to Leviticus 14:2-9. Along the way they are healed, but only one seems to recognize the healing. He returns and glorifies God.

Jesus notes this: "Ten were cleansed were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God."

Naaman's life was completely changed, as were the lives of the ten lepers. Gratitude seems to be such a small price to pay for such goodness. Today's readings encourage us to pause along our journey and give thanks for those moments when God is revealed in many and surprising ways. As we reflect on the Word today, let us pray that we will be Christians who will be formed with hearts that are filled with gratitude and praise.

Let us not forget that the word 'Eucharist' derived from Greek means 'thanksgiving'. Jesus "gave thanks' before sharing his Body and Blood at the Last Supper. Today, as always, we give thanks to God for all the blessings we have received and continue to receive, especially for Jesus Christ, God's only Son, whom we receive today at Mass, as food for our journey.



SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
