<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>**Pre-Jordan</u></u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is to be announced.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for **each** child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.</u>

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

The passage from Mark's gospel today is from Chapter 8, v 27-35. This is a turning point in Mark's gospel. In the first 8 chapters of his Gospel, Mark has portrayed the people around Jesus, both friend and foe, as people blind to the true meaning of his miraculous works. Up to now there were 19 miraculous works and Jesus says to those following him, "Do you still not understand?" There are also 3 clear predictions of Jesus passion, each followed by his disciples continued lack of comprehension. Peter brings this to a head in today's passage. This is the first major climax of Mark's Gospel drama.

Until now, Mark has been revealing who Jesus is in the mighty deeds he has done. Along with this revelation, Mark has also reported Jesus' reluctance to have people believe in him only because of those wondrous deeds. The passage in today's gospel sees Jesus and the apostles as they set out for Caesarea Philippi. Jesus now says explicitly that his way is a way of suffering. The way of the Messiah is the way of the cross.

Peter and the other disciples were not ready for this. They wanted a leader who would deliver them from pain, specifically from the occupation of the Romans and restore the Kingdom of Israel to past glories. In fact, Peter rebukes Jesus in verse 32. This gets a reaction of anger from Jesus as if Peter is the devil himself. "Get behind me Satan, you are thinking not as God does but as human beings do."

The ultimate answers to this drama are not going to come until much later, specifically not until after the Resurrection. The urgency of this whole section of the Gospel does provoke profound questions for individual Christians and for the whole church.

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me" (8:34) Notice that Jesus does not say take up "the cross" or "my cross" but rather "his (her) cross" – each disciple's specific cross. How differently shaped and weighted each disciple's cross is.

What shape does our particular cross take? What is the heaviest aspect of it? We may not have encountered it yet but will we be ready when we see it? Will we be ready when we begin to experience it? Let us reflect on what it means to each of us taking up his/her cross.

Each time we enter a church, we have the opportunity to renew our baptism. The holy water is a symbol for life but it is also a symbol of purification. We are welcomed into the life of the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We also embrace the cross as we trace it's outline on our body. May it remind us always of what Jesus asks us to do.

May our prayer be for God's grace in discerning and carrying our cross as we follow Jesus.
