CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, September 18 @ 7pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

Our Old Testament reading today comes from the Book of Sirach. Specifically it is also called "the Wisdom of Sirach" with the author being Jesus ben (son of) Sira, meaning Son of Sira. We know really nothing about him other than what we can deduce from the book. He ran a school for scriptural study and Jewish wisdom in Alexandria Egypt which was then under the Greek Empire until 63 BC. He wanted to instruct his fellow Jews who were confused by the philosophical questions of the Greeks. He wrote that all wisdom comes from God – not Greek thought! Sirach says that wisdom came forth from the mouth of God to make her dwelling with God's people. He is reminding the Jews of the day, and us, that God's wisdom is far above the wisdom of the world. Scholars have determined it was written around the year 180 BC, quite late in the Old Testament period.

The Book of Sirach forms part of the "deuterocanonical" books, also referred to as the apocrypha. The designation means that from earliest times Jewish scholars did not include it among the books of Scripture. They would use it however in worship and study. It did not take its place among the sacred books in the Jewish canon. The Catholic Church eventually placed it in the canon of scripture which was a whole other process. Sirach is part of what we see as the Wisdom Literature of the old testament: Proverbs, Job, Ecclesiastes, Wisdom, Sirach, Song of Songs and the Psalms. It is noteworthy that there are seven books of Wisdom literature in the Catholic Canon of the Old Testament and the number seven is symbolic of perfection.

Forgiveness can be both the easiest and the most difficult thing a person is asked to give. Daily life is filled with moments in which we ask for forgiveness. Often a simple pardon is given without much thought. But this may not always be the case since some moments are not so easily forgotten. The teaching today in this passage is that we cannot nourish anger and expect our own sins to be forgiven. Sirach tells us that wrath and anger are hateful things. He reminds us of the damaging effects that anger and vengeance can bring to our soul. Sirach asks us to renounce vengeance and "set enmity aside" 28:6

St. Paul in the continuing passages from the letter to the Romans reminds us that ultimately, we are not autonomous. Both in life and death we are the Lord's

In the passage from Matthew today, Jesus tells this story after Peter proposes an extravagant level of forgiveness the biblical number of perfection, "seven times". Jesus however recalculates this, changing the seven to seventy seven times. In some older translations we hear it as seventy times seven times. This indicates infinity and challenges us to surpass even perfection with a forgiveness as wildly boundless as God's forgiveness toward us. Jesus made forgiveness a non-negotiable requirement of the life of faith. In other words,

Don't set limits.

Don't keep score. Keep forgiving!



SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
