# Pastor's Page

A very simple idea can sum up our scripture readings today. Love implies Sacrifice. Those who are dedicated to a given commitment know that their dedication in reality requires sacrifice. Love means giving of oneself.

The prophet Jeremiah did everything he could to avoid proclaiming the message of the Lord and living the life of a prophet. "You duped me, O Lord", Jeremiah the reluctant prophet exclaims at the beginning of the first reading. Jeremiah is one of the great tragic figures of the Old Testament. He preached to the complacent and falsely secure people of the southern kingdom of Judah in the years before the Babylonian exile. (587 BC) After Jerusalem was destroyed Jeremiah communicated God's message not only through his words and oracles but also through his own life of suffering and struggle. His message of warning and struggle was as you would expect an unwelcome one.

Jeremiah was compelled to cry out the message of God's judgment for which he was ridiculed and reproached. He even tried to stop proclaiming this message. He was weary of his call as a prophet, he was angry at God. He even accused God of duping him as we hear today. All this, and yet he was unable to give up his calling. God's message still burns in his heart.

In our second reading today, the Apostle Paul expressed the costly nature of faith in Christ. Throughout biblical history Israel had offered sacrifices to God. In the New Testament, in Christ, we are called to give ourselves as "living" sacrifices. We must transform and open our minds so we can discern and do the will of God in our lives. Paul was clear that the life of faith was a costly affair. It means embracing the will of God as our own good and happiness.

In the gospel passage today from Matthew, the first prediction of the passion removes any doubts about what kind of Messiah Jesus is. In verse 21 Jesus proclaims unambiguously that his earthly future will involve suffering and death in accord with his Father's plan. As Jesus begins to reveal this part of God's plan to the disciples, it does not match their expectations of what should happen. God is powerful. The Messiah will triumph over adversity and oppression. Yes this will happen but not in the way they expect. Their expectation is that Jesus will restore the nation of Israel to its glory days of David's and Solomon's kingdom a thousand years previous.

Despite Peter's confession of faith that we heard last week, Peter in verse 22, rejects the possibility that Jesus messiahship could involve suffering. Jesus promptly and emphatically corrects Peter's misconception as coming from Satan, as a stumbling block in Jesus' way and as purely human thinking. Sayings on the cost and reward of discipleship follow that first prediction of the passion. Here they are warned that discipleship also involves a share in the cross.

The calling of Jesus Christ to follow him requires a response from each one of us. We are called to make a sacrifice. Our sacrifice is not as great as our Lord's and may not be as overwhelming as Jeremiah's. As Paul says to the Romans, we make a sacrifice when we resist conforming ourselves to the secular world. We are called to deny ourselves at times, take up our cross and follow Him. Let each sign of the cross we make remind us of the sacrifice we are called to offer. Let us pray for the willingness and courage to live in Christ-like ways.



## **Parish Resources**

#### <u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
