CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>**Pre-Jordan</u>** - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent **Pre-Jordan is Monday, September 12 at 7PM in the Chapel.**</u>

Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

<u>RCIA</u> - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

In our first reading today from the Book of Wisdom it reminds us that we run the race of life ultimately by faith, not by human sight. Our mortal minds cannot know the future. Our corruptible bodies cannot outrun illness and death. But faith gives us the courage to go on and finish strong. Faith is a gift. We need to nourish and use this gift.

As we read the passage from Luke's Gospel this week we see the narrative continuing with Jesus' journey toward Jerusalem. (Luke 14:25-33). It has been an exhausting and challenging journey that started its decisive turn in Chapter 9: vs. 51 when they headed south from Galilee through Samaria. (you may want to go back and read those verses)

Remember back to Chapter 9 vs. 57-62 when the journey toward Jerusalem takes its decisive turn: "Whoever puts his hand to the plow but keeps looking back is unfit for the reign of God" This is where we ask Jesus for the grace and strength to keep looking forward with our focus on the road ahead. Looking back can take us right off the road. Or hit an obstacle.

Jesus talks about what is needed for the total commitment in verses 28-29. "If one of you decides to build a tower, will he not first sit down and calculate the outlay to see if he has enough money to complete the project. He will do that for fear of laying the foundation and then not being able to complete the work."

As this journey continues, Jesus is teaching about the seriousness of discipleship. The call to follow Him cannot be made half-heartedly. I am sure at one point they, and us at times might say to Jesus, "Couldn't Christianity be more successful and popular if you eased up on us all? Or "Are you sure you know what you are doing Jesus?" Jesus of course knew what he was doing. He wanted to make sure those who were following him knew what they were doing too. What do we make of these hard sayings of Jesus? He wanted disciples to finish strong in the journey of following Him.

Jesus had no desire to "spin" the truth. He did not want to offend. But he did intend to shock the hearer into a higher level of commitment. Jewish leaders of the first century often used overstatement and exaggeration with their disciples. Hence the use of the terminology "hating father and mother, wife and children, brother, sister and even his own life" The meaning here is that anyone or anything that stands in the way of thorough commitment to Jesus must be renounced. This is the radical message of the cross.

Jesus wants us to be alert that the hill is steep in places that we will be asked to climb. Jesus would be doing us no good to soft sell the pressing need for absolute commitment to the journey and the reign of God. If someone begins the journey under an illusion of ease, then we are headed for certain disappointment. Jesus knows that it does not prepare his followers for the harsh times that may come, they will wilt under the pressure and quit too soon.

Jesus was a finisher. At this death he cried, "It is finished" He did not quit. He calls us to follow in his steps and live as witnesses. It is not always an easy climb. It is not always a popular journey, but we will never be totally alone either. Christ will be there. He has gone before us. His presence will enable us to finish strong.

<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
