CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

Baptism - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

Pre-Jordan - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is to be announced. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for **each** child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

Marriage - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep—November 16, 2024. See page 4 of the bulletin for further details.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

Let us give thanks to the Lord Our God"!

This is the invitation the priest gives to the congregation right before the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer. In the "old" (pre-2011) translation the response was, "it is right to give Him thanks and praise". The new translation is aligned more closely to the Latin text, "Dignum et justum est" very simply and literally translated "it is right and just". The idea is the same though. We have an obligation to give thanks and praise to our God.

The invitation right before that is also something we can mediate upon. "Lift up your hearts! When we pray, we lift up our hearts to the Lord. We are basically going outside of ourselves, lifting ourselves up to communicate with God and Jesus. We enter into a very special relationship. We respond to an invitation.

As we enter into another Academic year, it is good to look at our obligation to give thanks and praise. Setting aside time on the Sabbath to celebrate the Eucharist is certainly an obligation we have. But we need to do more if we are going to develop our relationship with God. It helps us to observe the Third Commandment to keep the Sabbath Day holy. But what we do is certainly more than just obligation.

The word Eucharist itself means "Thanksgiving". We are giving thanks to God for everything we have. We are also entering into the Sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross. We unite ourselves to Jesus. That is the notion of Communion. The Body and Blood of Christ is food for our spiritual journey. Just as we would not think of going weeks without regular food, we need to realize the gift of the spiritual food that Jesus gives us for our journey. "Do this in memory of me"

As we go forth from our assembly today, let us reflect on the Word that we have heard. May our eyes and ears be opened to a deeper faith in the Lord Jesus. The Word describes the awesome power of God that transforms our lives and the lives of others.

If you know someone, a relative or a friend who has lost sight of the importance of giving thanks and praise to God at the Eucharistic Liturgy, invite them back. They will be glad you did.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
